This document applies to all parts of The Pilgrims' School, including parents and pupils in the Early Years Foundation Stage.

At Pilgrims', we aim to report to parents four times a term. The format of this communication differs from time-to time (see below), but a report's main aim is to inform the parents and the pupil about current progress, *and* to offer advice about future development.

What is a Report?

A report describes, either in writing or orally, a pupil's response to teaching or to an aspect of school life and offers advice about future development.

A good report:

- records what has been covered
- describes the pupils' response to teaching
- gives advice for future learning

Reporting types

1. **Assessment cards**
2. **End of Term Reports**
3. **Examination Reports**
4. **Parents' Meetings**

1. Assessment cards

Their purpose is to inform, to encourage or to offer guidance for improvement, as necessary.

They summarise a pupil's Effort and Attainment during a specified period of the term.

Recording

Effort is given as a Letter -

Effort is judged by the quality of a pupil's written and oral work, and his attitude in class. A subjective element in this judgement is unavoidable.

Attainment is given as a number indicating:

| 3 | Work is fair and around Pilgrims' year group expectations |

It is possible to assign two numbers (i.e. 1/2 or 2/3) thus making this a seven-point scale. Pilgrims' year group expectations would be identified by looking at the learning objectives set out in the planning.

Evaluation

Teachers offer a written comment.

Tutors discuss performance with tutees. Tutors review their tutees' performance in the light of these cards.

2. Full Reports

Reports' main targets are the parents, to whom they are informative. Pupils have access to them, to which end they should also be motivating.

Full reports use the above effort and attainment scores, but also offer a much fuller written comment.

These are issued at the end of the:

- Christmas term Years R – 8
- Lent term Year 8
- Summer term Years R - 7

Full reports consist of **subject reports** and **other reports**:

- **Subject Reports**

A good report records what has been covered, describes the pupils' response to teaching and gives advice for future learning.

Work covered:

This is self-explanatory. Bullet points are perfectly acceptable. One always suspects reports where the length of the preamble exceeds that of the comment on the pupil's performance.

Pupil's response:

This need not be highly subjective. It need not be vague. It should primarily record achievement based on the evidence of written and oral work and will include reference to the pupil's attitude in class.

Targets/things to work on:

These should be as specific as possible. After all, they are the prime means of guiding the pupils in their further learning and teachers in their future plans.

- **Other Reports**

Reports on pupils' responses to aspects of school life outside the classroom are also included. The aspects covered vary and may include:

Instrumental lessons	for those receiving them
Choir	Choristers and Quiristers
Games	for members of teams
House	Boarders

for those receiving individual lessons

- **Tutor Report**

The Tutor should comment primarily on a boy's character and social progress (how well he gets on with peers, how well he listens to advice, and so on) and the breadth of his engagement with school life (how well he contributes to the community, the activities he enjoys...). It should be evident that the Tutor has a relationship with the boy that brings anecdotes and information in addition to what is written in subject reports. The Tutor should also comment upon general trends and general direction of academic development, though without drifting into a summary and extensive quotation of the reports (for this role, please see Headmaster's Comment, below).

- **Headmaster's Comment**

The Headmaster's Comment summarizes the reports, quoting content, and offers a concluding comment on the boy's progress and prospects.

3. Examination Reports

These are produced after the mid-year examinations in January for Years 5 - 7. They provide a summary of performance and advice about future improvement. Exam score, median for the class, and a short comment is offered.

4. Parents' Meetings

Parents are always welcome to discuss any aspect of their sons and their work at any convenient time.

Formal parents' meetings are held once a year and provide opportunity for parents to talk privately with their son's teachers.

Five minutes are allowed for each interview, but it can be continued or followed-up at any mutually convenient time.

Reporting cycle

Reports on the boys are generally issued four times a term: at each exeat, half term and end of term. The form of that report does change from year group to year group and term to term.
